Vicar Writes

Dear family in Christ

We are thankful that diocesan bishop Rennis has granted a special dispensation for parishes and congregations in the Archdeaconry of Singapore to practise one or more of the following three forms of administering Holy Communion during the period 2 August to 31 October 2020 to address the extraordinary situation posed by the COVID-19 pandemic.

- 1. Holy Communion to a congregation that <u>physically gathers</u> and safely distributes the bread and the wine in a manner that satisfy the safety standards specified by the national authorities for churches.
- 2. Holy Communion <u>by extension from a common table</u>, whereby diocesan authorised persons distribute pre-consecrated elements to dispersed households or small groups at their respective locations using a simple liturgy.
- 3. Holy Communion through an Online Service with good controls to a congregation that is electronically present and connected.

We praise and thank God that one powerful aspect of the Lord's Supper is the communal experience of breaking bread and praying together. At our parish, we will celebrate Holy Communion on-site physically and online electronically on the first and third weekends at the following service timings:

- Saturday 4.30 pm (English)
- Sunday 9.00 am (English)
- Sunday 11.15 am (Mandarin)

Understanding the Graeco-Roman World of the New Testament

Course Synopsis: Christianity was not born in a vacuum. It was birthed into the Graeco-Roman world of political stability, cultural diversity and religious paganism. Despite being in an environment where politics, economics, society and culture were all organised around the pagan deities, the church grew. There were favourable factors that were advantageous to the growth and spread of Christianity in the first century. However, the developing Christian church also faced hindrances that were disadvantageous to the acceptance of early Christianity.

Despite the obstacles and struggles, the Early Church persevered and grew tremendously in a pagan environment. By God's grace, some of the hindrances were used to promote the Christian faith. This course will look at the political, economic, cultural, social and religious characteristics of the Graeco-Roman world of the first century. This will enable us to appreciate the background to the Gospels, the Acts of the Apostles, Paul's letters to the newly-planted churches in the various cities and also the other NT Epistles.
